Javier Amaya es colombiano, educador de salud pública, activista de derechos humanos, corresponsal por seis años de la revista *Colombia Hoy* de Bogotá, colaborador ocasional de *La Opinión* de Los Angeles, actualmente corresponsal del periódico *Crónica Latina* de Londres. Su cuento "Un Angel en la Catedral" aparece en la revista literaria *Raven Chronicles* (Fall 1997). Su presentación es parte de la serie "Culturas de las Américas," a cargo del Latin American Studies Program, JSIS, con el apoyo de UW's Walter Chapin Simpson Center for the Humanities.

Javier Amaya is Colombian, a public health educator, human rights activist, and journalist. He was a correspondent for six years for *Colombia Hoy*, and continues to contribute to *La Opinión* (Los Angeles) and *Crónica Latina* (London). His short story "Un Angel en la Catedral" appears in *Raven Chronicles* (Fall 1997). His talk is part of the Culturas de las Américas series, organized by the Latin American Studies Program, JSIS with support from the UW's Walter Chapin Simpson Center for the Humanities. His literary reading and discussion will be in Spanish, followed by a bilingual question and answer session with the audience.
